



## Kansas Corn Yield Contest

### Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Who can verify my fields?

A: According to the rules, the following people qualify as verifiers/advisors. If you need to update the advisor you listed in your registration, please email [yields@ksgrains.com](mailto:yields@ksgrains.com)

- County or area extension agent/specialist
  - NRCS Natural Resources Conservation Service Employee
  - FSA Farm Service Agency CED/Loan Manager/Officer
  - SWCD Soil & Water Conservation District employee
  - Farm Credit Services Officer
  - Bank Ag Loan Officer
  - Private Crop Consultant or Agronomist
  - FFA advisor
  - Vocational agriculture instructor
  - College of Agriculture Instructor
  - American Society of Farm Managers Accredited Farm Manager
  - Crop Insurance Agent/Adjustor
  - Also if someone is retired from one of these positions
- Supervisors cannot be the following:**
- Anyone that has a financial or direct business tie to a company that sells agribusiness supplies (seed or chemical rep, farm equipment salesperson, etc)
  - An employee or relative of the entrant
  - The contest entrant
  - Growers serving on state association or checkoff board

Q: Why did I need to list two supervisors? Do they both have to be present?

A: We asked for you to list two so that there is a better chance one is available at the time of harvest. You only need to have one supervisor present.

Q: Why do I have to list an email address for the verifiers?

A: You must list an accurate email address for the verifier as they will be forwarded your entry and asked to verify the information.

Q: What do I do with the scale ticket?

A: You upload a picture of your scale ticket to complete your entry form.

Q: How many fields can I enter?



A: Each member that is registered can enter three different entries.

Q: Do I have to include the GPS location of the field?

A: Yes, you must include the GPS location to help us verify which district the entries is in. The GPS location of the field will not be shared publicly.

Q: Can I use the same entry form from the NCGA contest for the KCGA contest?

A: No, unfortunately that is not an option. You must complete the online form to be entered.

Q: Can I use the same field for both the NCGA and KCGA contests?

A: Yes, you may use the same fields, but must enter both contests separately.

Q: When is the deadline for harvest entries?

A: Harvest entries must be in by December 1, 2019.
