We Grow Corn! Book



Seed to STEM 2019 Summer Workshops

Kansas Corn hosted over 100 middle school and high school science teachers at our Seed to STEM Summer Workshops at Olathe and Maize early this summer. The workshops focused on labs on corn, biotechnology and ethanol. The Olathe workshop participants toured Finley Farms at Edgerton and the East Kansas Agri Energy ethanol plant at Garnett. The Maize workshop toured the Dennis Gruenbacher Farm at Colwich and Kansas Ethanol at Lyons. Each participant walked away with over \$500 worth of materials and 10 new labs to teach in their classroom.

Ear to Ear Mentor Program Gains 10 New Teachers

Ear to Ear Mentor program is a one-week summer course where selected teachers receive advanced training on how to bring inquiry-based learning to their classrooms and schools. Teachers learn about corn, and how they can use the crop as a model for teaching science.

This year, ten new teachers and three returning teachers participated in the program. They represented the entire state from Garden City to Olathe. Graduates of this program are encouraged to mentor other teachers in their schools to teach about corn while using Kansas Corn's education resources to aid in their teaching success.

Breakout Box Do you know your moo?

Kansas is one of the largest beef-producing and corn-producing states, and agriculture is the largest industry in Kansas. This breakout is designed for middle school and high school students and will provide them with basic knowledge of the beef industry. Students will learn about the common breeds of cattle, the beef life cycle, products made from beef, beef cuts, and facts about grain- and grass-finished beef.
