TYPES OF CORN



The color of the **kernels** is dark yellow.

The kernels on the ear are dry and hard.

There is a dent on the top of the kernel.

It is used for livestock feed, **fuel**, food and other uses.





The color of the kernels is yellow or white or both.

The kernels on the ear are soft and easy to eat.

It tastes sweet and is juicy.

It is used for people to eat.

DENT CORN SWEET CORN FLINT CORN



The kernels can be many different colors.

The kernels on the ear have a hard shell.

It is also known as Indian Corn.

It is used for fall decorations and is used for food.

POPCORN



The color of the kernels is a deep yellow color.

The kernels are on a small ear and are dry and hard.

The kernels pop when heated.

It is used for a snack food.
