Homeschool educators can now request an educational kit and lesson packet. Each of the K-5 classroom lessons were rewritten to be compatible for homeschool learners. PreK Kit Available for Preschool and Daycare Educators

Preschool and daycare educators can now request a PreK kit. The PreK kit includes eight lessons centered around the new "We Grow Corn, Seasons on a Kansas Family Farm" book, where children will learn about the four seasons and growing corn while using their cognitive and fine motor skills. In addition to the book, the kit will include craft supplies and playdough mats that will bring a farm to the children's learning environment. Children will use the mats to make equipment tires, compare the height of different corn plants, plant their own corn seeds and show what a farmer does during each season of the year.

2023 Seed to STEM Summer Workshop--Registration Is Open

June 12-13 at Salina South Middle School in Salina

June 15-16 at Seaman High School in Topeka

Seed to STEM Track 1.0 and Track 2.0 will both be available at the June 12-13 workshop in Salina and the June 15-16 workshop in Topeka. These free workshops are for 6th through 12th grade Kansas science teachers.

Teachers who are selected will practice over 10 labs they can use in the classroom to help students learn science and the roles science plays in agriculture. The workshop includes a farm and field visit, an ag industry dinner and a field trip to an ethanol plant. In addition, every teacher will receive \$500 worth of free lab resources, plus all onsite expenses paid. Graduate credit will also be available at a cost to the participant.

The 1.0 Track is available for teachers that have never participated before and has an application deadline of April 1, 2023. For those teachers returning to learn more, the 2.0 Track applications are due March 1, 2023. Participants will be selected based on the quality of their application.
