Free Summer Scientist Kit- Teach About the Scientific Method

Educators and volunteers leading a summer program will enjoy using our "Summer Scientist: Does Corn Need Light?" kit for their children. Your children will work like scientists, using the scientific method, to explore the role light plays in growing a healthy corn plant. The kit includes enough pots, soil, corn seed, measuring spoons and journals for your students. In addition, the kit includes five "We Grow Corn!" books, an activity guide, and an instruction guide to help your scientists through the investigation. On the days your children are observing their plant's



growth, use the book to take them through the year-long process of growing corn. Using the activity guide, you can provide hands-on activities and online challenges to help your scientists expand their learning. Kansas Corn STEM will accept requests until April 12th.

Seed to STEM Workshop- Deadline April 1st

The 2024 Seed to STEM workshop will be held at Buhler High School on June 2-3. This free workshop is for 6th through 12th grade Kansas science teachers. Teachers who are selected will practice over 10 labs they can use in the classroom to help students learn the role science plays in agriculture. The workshop includes a farm and field visit, an ag industry dinner and a field trip to an ethanol plant. Every teacher will receive \$500 worth of free lab supplies, and all onsite expenses will be paid. Graduate credit will be available at a cost to the participant. The 1.0 track is available for teachers who



have not participated before and has an application deadline of April 1, 2024. Participants will be selected based on the quality of their application.


